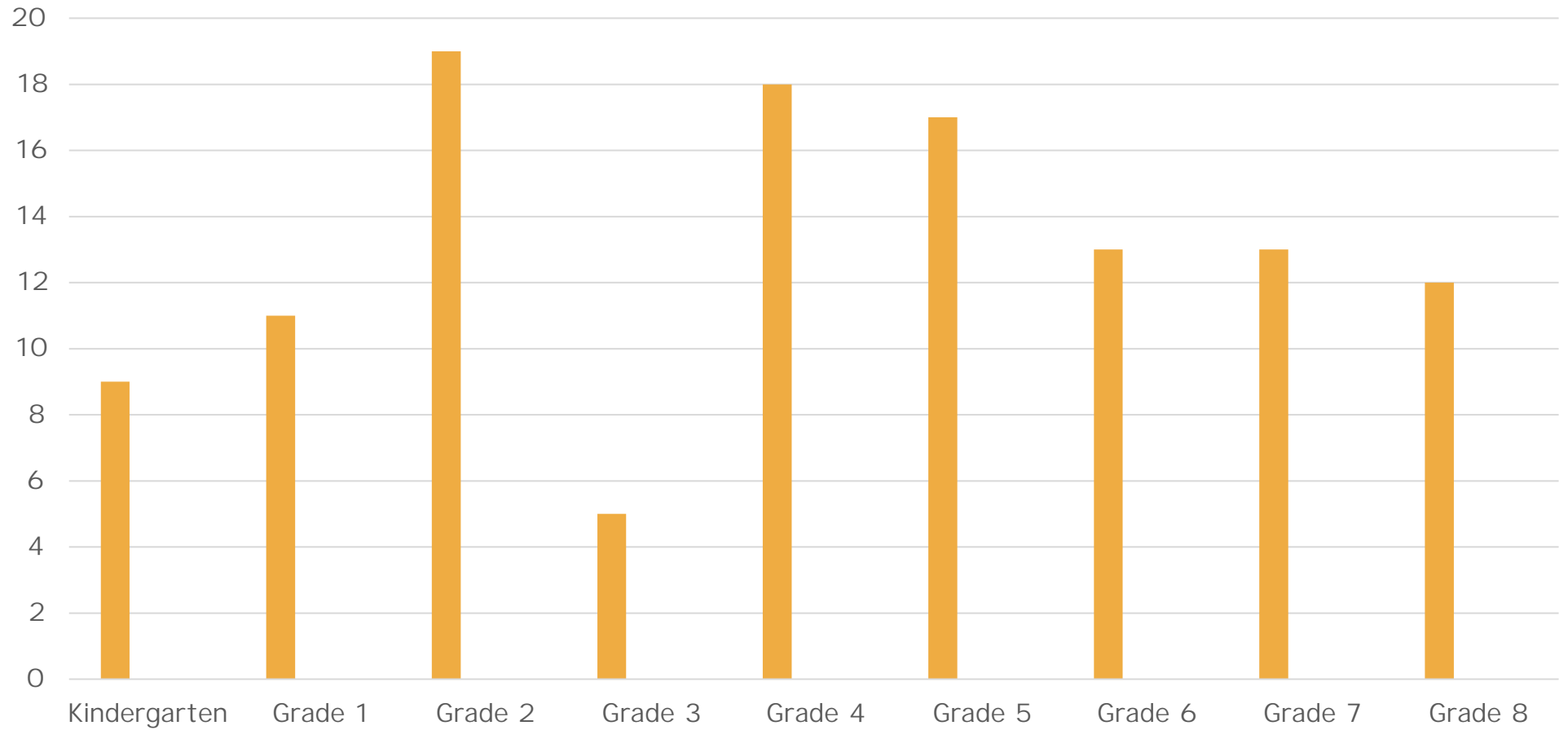

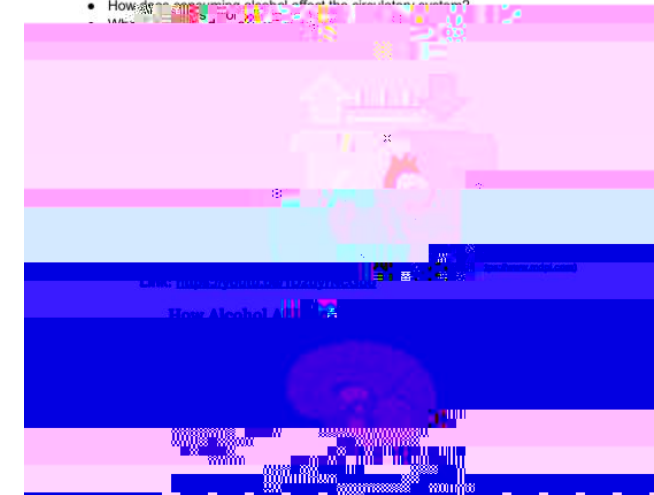

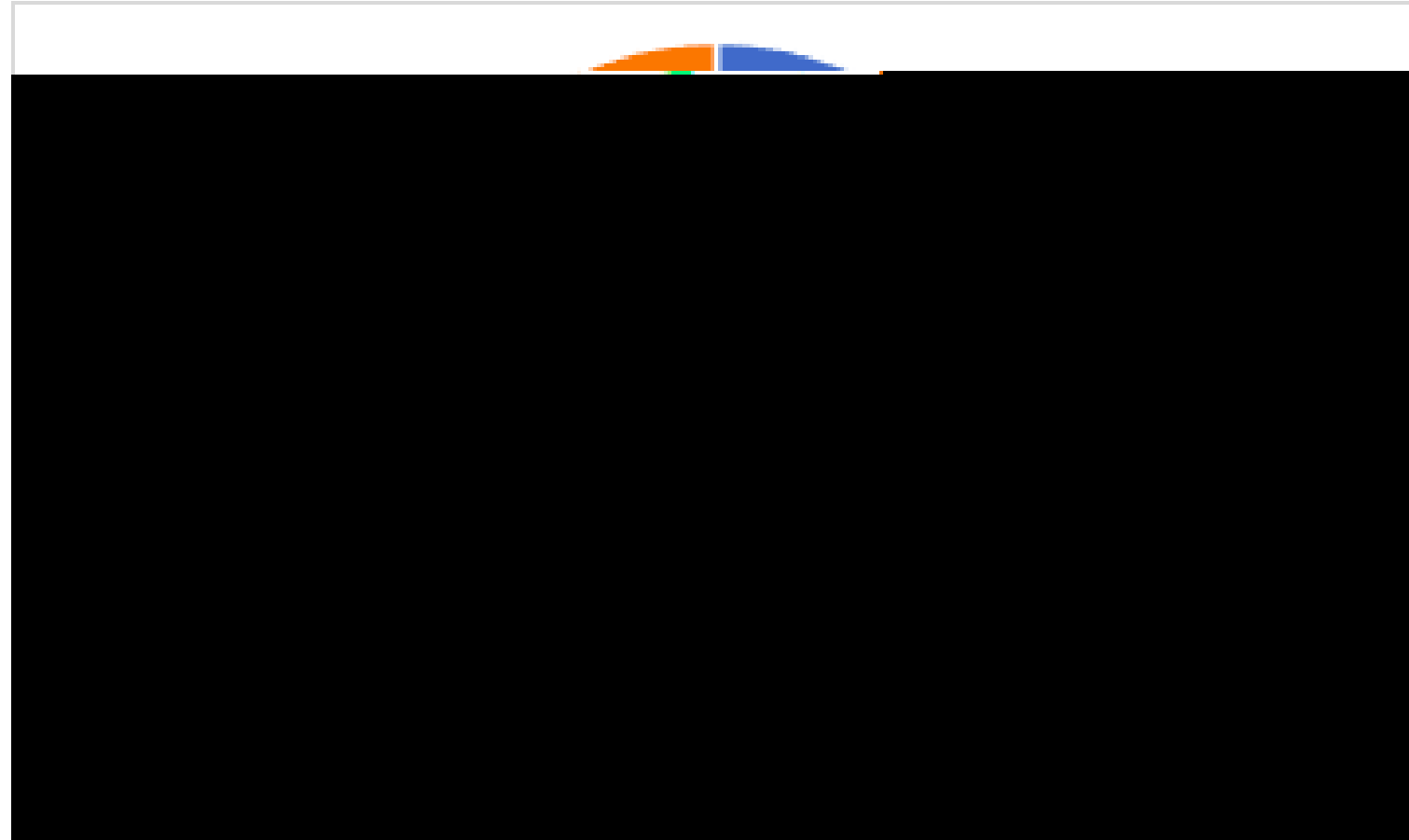

Enrolment) School Age vs Adult

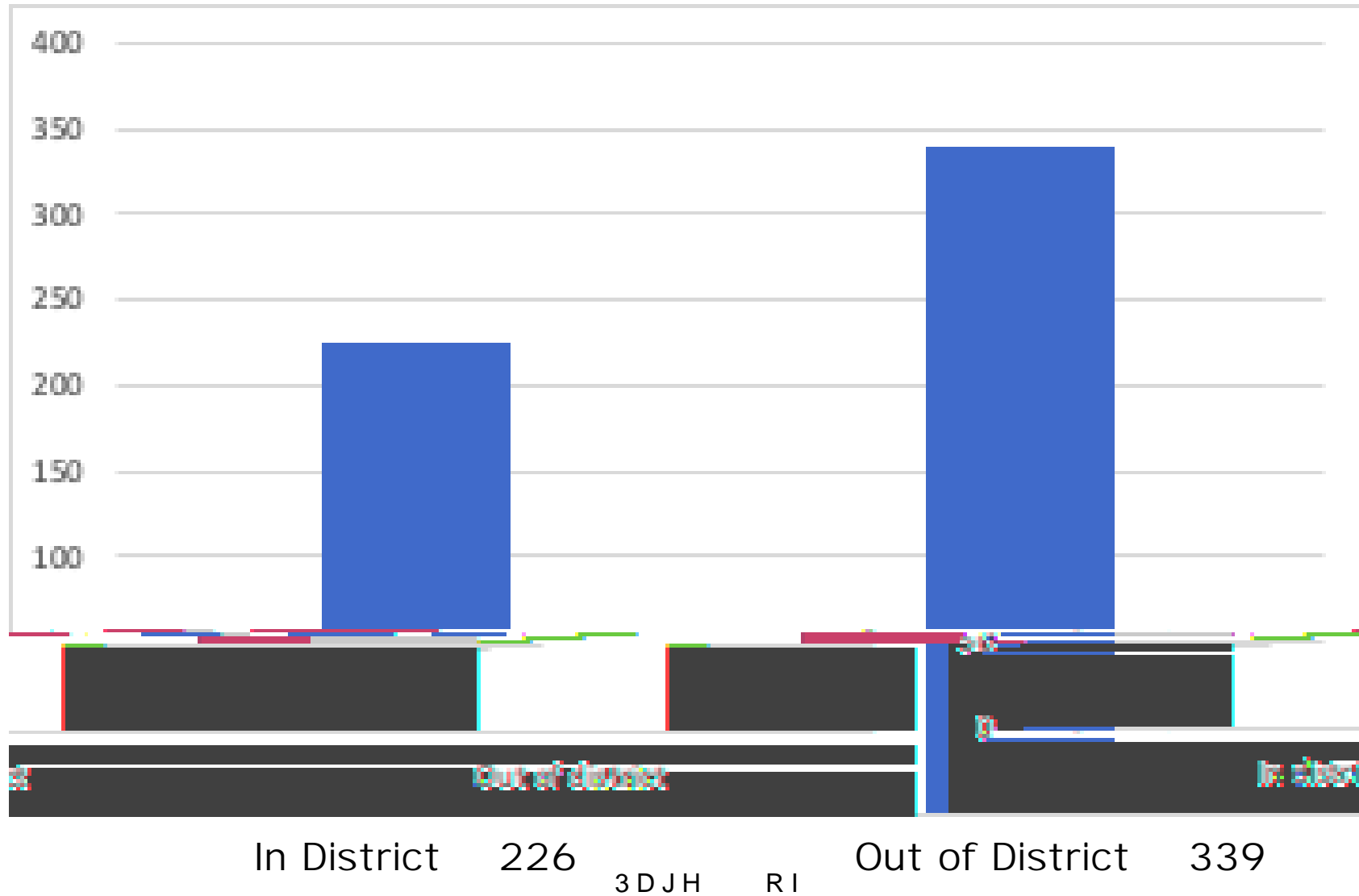

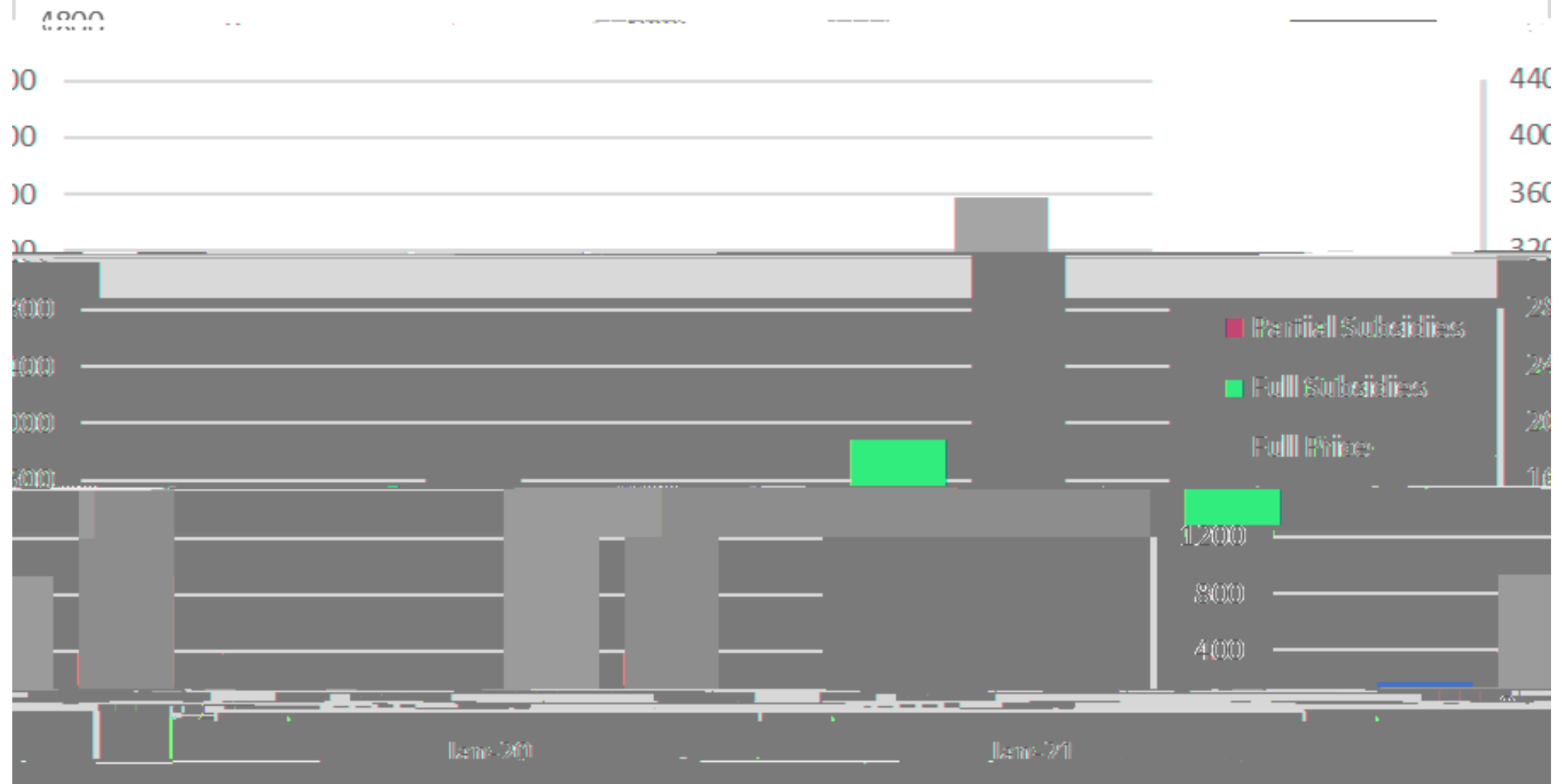

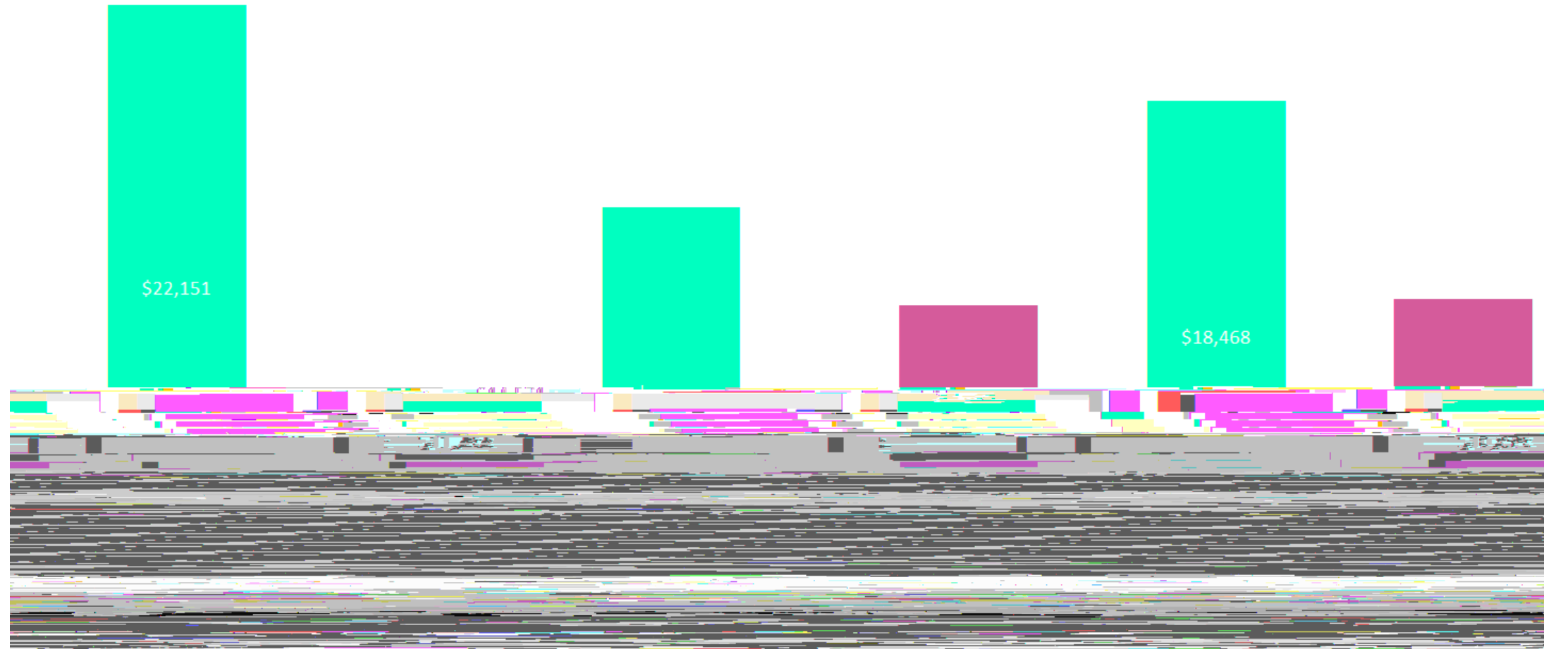
